Do not wait for winter. Test your home heating equipment now.

According to the <u>U.S. Fire Administration (USFA)</u>, half of all home heating fires occur in December, January, and February. Heat your home safely before the weather turns bitter cold.

Follow these USFA tips for a fire-safe home this

#### winter.

- Keep anything that can burn at least three (3) feet from all heat sources including fireplaces, wood stoves, radiators, space heaters, or candles.
- Never use an oven to heat your home.
- Maintain heating equipment and chimneys by having them cleaned and inspected annually by a qualified professional.

# Plug space heaters directly into wall outlets.


Never use an extension cord or power strip.


### All heaters need space.
